

Frederick Whittlesey made this sixth day of November in
 the year of our Lord One thousand Eight hundred & thirty six
 John P Cushman Between Frederick Whittlesey of the City of Rochester of the
 County of Monroe and State of New York of the first part, and John P Cushman of the City
 of Troy of the County of Rensselaer State aforesaid of the second part. Witnesseth
 That the said party of the first part in consideration of the sum of ten thousand dollars to him
 duly paid, the receipt whereof is hereby Confessed and acknowledged hath sold and by these
 presents doth grant and Convey to the said party of the second part his heirs and assigns, all
 that certain piece or parcel of land situate in the City of Rochester aforesaid being part of lot number
 two hundred and twenty three (No 223) in Rochester Carroll & Fitzhugh's Addition bounded as follows
 beginning on the North side of Buffalo Street at a point thirty two feet two inches and a quarter Eastward
 of the South East corner of the City Hotel building, thence North 16° 30' West ninety one feet 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ inches
 to an angle thence North 20° West One hundred and four feet to the North line of said lot No 223
 thence Westward along the North line of said lot No 223 to the West line of said lot thence Southward
 along the West line of said lot to a point on said West line thirty seven feet and two inches Northward
 from Buffalo Street - thence on a line at right angles with Buffalo Street to said Buffalo Street
 striking the same at a point twelve feet Eastward from the intersection of the West line of Rochester
 Carroll & Fitzhugh's purchase with Buffalo Street thence Eastward on Buffalo Street to the place
 of beginning - Also all that piece or parcel of land situate in said City of Rochester
 bounded as follows, Commencing at a point where a line drawn at right angles with
 Buffalo Street twelve feet distant Eastward from where the West line of Rochester, Carroll
 & Fitzhugh's purchase intersects the North line of said Buffalo Street & being thirty seven
 feet and two inches Northward from said street - thence running Southward at right angles with
 said Buffalo Street One hundred and thirteen feet and ten inches - thence Eastward thirty six feet
 to the West line of said Rochester, Carroll and Fitzhugh's purchase, thence Southward along the West
 line of said purchase to the place of beginning - Also all that piece or parcel of land situate
 in said City of Rochester and bounded as follows - On the West by Elizabeth Street and extending
 East to the West line of the hundred acre tract so called, on the South by a lot formerly owned
 by Richard Gorline and the last above described piece of land being lot No 150 in Will
 and Atkinson's Canal Tract and being the same lot Conveyed by the Sheriff of Monroe
 County, to John P Cushman by deed dated the 24th day of October 1835 - This Grant
 is intended as a security for the payment of the sum of Ten Thousand dollars the purchase
 money of the above described premises as follows: viz. in ten equal annual payments from the four
 tenth day of July last with annual interest from the said fourteenth day of July last to be paid
 on the whole sum remaining unpaid at the time each particular payment becomes due, and
 to be paid at the same time the said Instalments are payable: according to the condition
 of a bond this day executed and delivered by the said Frederick Whittlesey to the said party
 of the second part; And this Conveyance shall be void, if such payment be made as herein
 specified. And in case default shall be made in the payment of the principal sum hereby
 intended to be secured, or in the payment of the interest thereon, or of any part of such principal
 or interest, as above provided, it shall be lawful for the party of the second part his Executors
 Administrators, or Assigns, at any time thereafter, to sell the premises hereby granted or
 any part thereof, in the manner prescribed by law, and out of the money arising
 from such sale, to retain the amount then due for principal and interest, together
 with the costs and charges of making such sale; and the surplus, if any there be,
 shall be paid by the party making such sale, on demand, to the said Frederick
 Whittlesey, his heirs or Assigns. In Witness whereof, the party of the first part
