 Bertha A. Broughton, his wife, of Detroit, Mich. parties of the first part, and  
 The University of Rochester, an Educational institution with its prin-  
 cipal office at 2490 University Avenue, Rochester, New York, party of the  
 second part.

Witnesseth that the parties of the first part, in consideration of  
 One dollar and other good and valuable consideration (\$100), lawful  
 money of the United States, in hand paid by the party of the second part  
 do hereby grant and release unto the party of the second part, its suc-  
 cessors and assigns forever, all,

that tract or parcel of land, situate in the Town of Brighton,  
 County of Monroe and State of New York, being that part of lots numbers two  
 (2), three (3) and four (4), in a subdivision of town lot number  
 seventy, sheet 1781, in the second division of lots in township thirteen, (13) in the seventh range of townships bounded on the south by  
 the lands of the unincorporated Erie Canal, commonly called Barge Canal,  
 on the north by the north-easterly line of said town lot, seventy-sheets 1781,  
 on the east by the easterly line of said subdivision lot number two  
 (2) and on the west by the lands of the Lehigh Valley Railroad, but by  
 intending to convey to the said party of the second part all of the  
 interest of the parties of the first part in and to all of that part of the

 party of the second part, its successors and assigns forever.


And said Elizabeth Broughton, Julia Broughton, Josephine Northway,
